Academic

Winchester House develops life-long learners, who thrive on challenge, adventure and a dynamic range of educational opportunities and experiences.

We inspire children to become fully immersed in their studies, with high aspirations on what they can achieve as an individual. Creative teaching, delivered by passionate teachers, ensures that the learning experience is active and engaging for all ages and abilities.

Following Pre-Prep (see later in prospectus), children move to The Seligman Building for Years 3 and 4. This modern, comfortable and inspiring learning space in the heart of the main school site, sits across two floors, with the children having a class teacher with specialist teaching across some subjects.

From Year 5, all classes are taught by subject specialist teachers (including three separate sciences), with small class sizes giving focused, personalised teaching throughout the school. Our extensive facilities feature modern classrooms throughout, as well as an IT suite, three science labs, art room, Design, Engineering and Technology class, language rooms and library.

We have a long proud history of supporting many children in achieving scholarships to leading Senior Schools across the country, with recent success to Stowe, Rugby, Cheltenham Ladies' College, Malvern, Radley and Uppingham.

At Winchester House, pupils follow the Common Entrance (CE) syllabus from Year 3 onwards, working towards examinations in Year 8 in preparation for their Senior School. This well-established, rigorous and dynamic framework, teaches and inspires discovery, curiosity and critical thinking skills across the curriculum, whilst helping pupils develop confidence, independent working skills, resilience and a love of learning.

School Life

We're a school community where every child is known personally and where we nurture every child's self-esteem to ensure that they develop resilience, and have the tools to tackle and overcome obstacles. Above all, we're determined that every child should have a safe and happy experience during their time at Winchester House.

Small tutor groups help build close relationships between children and tutors and all children belong to one of our four Houses, giving the opportunity for cross-year friendships to blossom.

Children can visit our Wellbeing Mentor to talk about feelings and share any worries they may have. Based in 'The Cupboard', a cosy room located between the School Office and Chapel, our Wellbeing Mentor's door is always open should someone need a chat.

The 'Circle of Support' outlines different people, opportunities and resources for children who need support and is displayed throughout the school.

'Buddy Benches' can be found in the playground, for when one of our younger children wishes to be included in games but might be feeling alone or nervous about joining in. Staff and children always keep an eye out for anyone using these benches so noone is ever without a buddy!

Winchester House has wraparound care from 7.30am to 6.30pm Monday to Friday. As well as a busy activity programme in the evenings, children from Year 3 can join Prep to work on their homework whilst still at School.

Pre-Prep Nursery to Year 2

The Pre-Prep at Winchester House is a small, close-knit family community. It's a collaborative, exciting and dynamic learning space where all the children know the teachers and all the teachers know the children.

Innovative learning practices, both inside and outside of the classroom, have created an environment of hands-on exploration and enrichment which sees children thrive.

Within the structure of our Creative Curriculum, a topic formulates the learning across the subjects for a term (apart from Maths and Phonics). From English to ICT, Music to Science, topics are taught creatively, weaving into the theme of that term's topic. Children in Pre-Prep enjoy subject specialist teaching in Music, ICT, French and PE.

Children also undertake a huge amount of enrichment activities to support their learning - experiences that complement and support the learning within the classroom, such as visits from a jungle roadshow and planetarium, trips to castles, museums and farms.





Sport

Sport is a cherished and traditional strength here at Winchester House, and with a comprehensive and exceptionally competitive fixture list in all major and minor games, the record of success is impressive.

Our all-inclusive approach gives children an opportunity to represent the School and experience all the additional benefits that come with it.

The core sports are rugby, hockey, cricket, netball, athletics and tennis. The children are coached by specialist staff from Nursery and leave Winchester House with a strong grounding in technique and sportsmanship.

Our superb onsite sporting facilities include rugby, football and hockey pitches, an outdoor swimming pool, an expansive Astroturf, cricket nets, squash courts and sports hall.

Away from core sports, children take part in a variety of exciting and challenging activities including polo, karate and skiing.

Music

Music is an integral part of our school life.

All children from Nursery age to Year 8 receive teaching in Music from specialist teachers as part of their curriculum, with over 150 additional individual lessons being taken every week in over a dozen different instruments, from piano to guitar to drums to bagpipes.

The vibrant curriculum covers a wide range of music disciplines, providing opportunity for children to learn across a wonderful spectrum of genres, from Beethoven to The Beatles to modern film scores.

Groups include woodwind, brass and guitar, with pupils being encouraged to form their own groups (including rock bands), school performances take place throughout the academic year with informal class concerts and large-scale annual summer and Christmas concerts, and musical trips in the UK and Europe are a regular part of the calendar.





Drama

We're passionate about the opportunities that Drama presents to our pupils. School shows and productions throughout the year provide an opportunity for pupils to hone their skills and showcase their abilities. Drama at Winchester House is taught organically, with an inclusive approach which encourages all pupils to thrive in. It's an approach where innovative practice, such as physical theatre and shadow puppetry, sits alongside traditional musical theatre, performances of Shakespeare and film-making.

LAMDA lessons are a key part of the school day, with around 100 pupils taking part every week.

Outdoor

Activities, clubs and external trips give pupils through the School opportunity and challenge in the outdoors.

Forest School is an important part of life up to Year 2 and in school activities, clubs and external trips give older pupils opportunity and challenge in the outdoors.

Our Secret Garden is a walled garden hidden within the school grounds that provides an exciting space for exploration and investigation in the outdoors. Areas in the garden are left to run wild but we also have a designated pergola for any outdoor lessons and a fire pit (which is particularly popular with boarders for marshmallow toasting in the evenings!).



Co-Curricular

Our enriching Co-Curricular programme is an integral and important part of life at Winchester House.

An exciting range of activities and clubs seek to engage and challenge pupils, helping them develop new skills and inspire lifelong passions and interests.

The broad choice covers academic areas such as Art Portfolio Club, Book Club and Study Buddies, sports such as Skiing, Tennis, Football and Badminton Clubs, and hobbies such as Chess Club, Card Sharks and Jewellery Making. For performing arts, children can choose activities such as Ballet, Musical Theatre and Dance.

A recent addition to the programme is Lacrosse Club on Saturday mornings, which is led by the Head of Lacrosse at Stowe.

Mastery Mornings for Years 7 and 8 are held twice per term on Saturday mornings, and give pupils the opportunity to broaden their learning, gain exposure to new ideas and inspire discovery in areas such as Computer Aided Design, 'Planning for my Future' and First Aid & Wellbeing.



Community

Our School motto *non nobis solum* (not for ourselves alone), is at the heart of our our philosophy and we're incredibly proud of the positive impact that Winchester House pupils continue to make in our local community.

Our busy, engaging and inspiring programme gives children across the whole school an opportunity to feel part of - and make a difference to - their community.

Activities include the Brackley Community Dementia-Friendly Choir which sees residents of local care homes visit the School for an informal sing-a-long with children, our Remembrance Service which welcomes back alumni to mark the occasion with current pupils, our annual Pumpkin Festival, a Classic Car Show and Flowers for Friends, where Winchester House families donate flowers to be distributed to local care homes.

Our Ignite speaker programme welcomes inspiring speakers to share their insights and experiences with pupils. Recent speakers have including broadcaster Clare Balding, CNN Reporter Clarissa Ward and Olympians Will Perry and James Rudkin.



Boarding

Our energetic, creative and nurturing Boarding Team create a real sense of home-away-from-home for our Boarders.

An exciting activity programme awaits our Boarders every evening - there's always something fun to do or new to try! There's time to just relax too, with comfortable lounges, big screen TVs, games rooms, chill-out spaces and kitchenettes. The Boarders also make the most of the wide-ranging facilities and grounds here at Winchester House, they will often be building camp fires and toasting marshmallows in the Secret Garden, enjoying an evening swim in our outdoor pool and getting some practice in at our indoor cricket nets.

We offer flexible Boarding options throughout the week, with many of our Day Children staying in our Boarding House for a few nights a week.





Alumni

On leaving Winchester House pupils become Housians; the collective name for our alumni. We keep in touch with Housians throughout their lives via an annual alumni magazine HOUSE, the "Under 30s" Club, the Ignite speaker programme, sporting fixtures, "class of" gatherings and exciting events like the Classic Car Show and Housian Carol Service.
